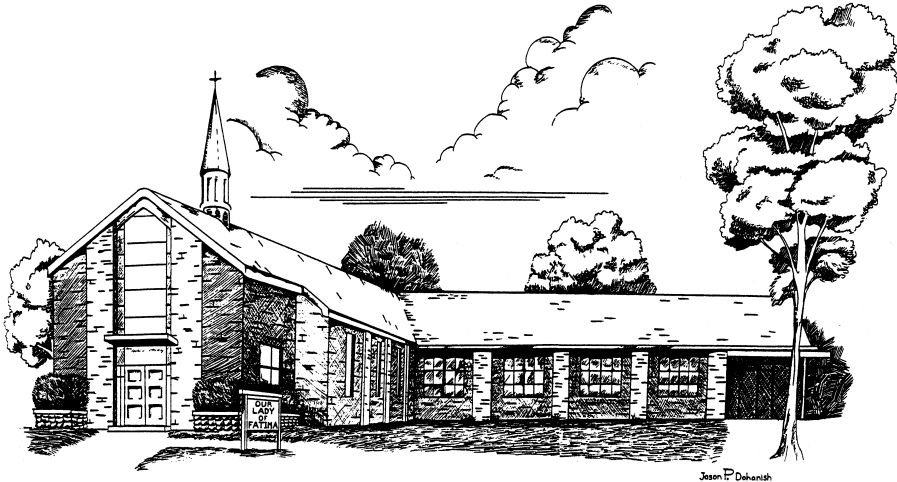

### **Go and Do Likewise**

For centuries, the road between Jerusalem and Jericho was extremely dangerous. It was called the "Red Road" or the "Bloody Way." In this very brief parable, we have a solitary traveler, who didn't join a group on this perilous journey. Not surprisingly, he was badly beaten and robbed. Three other travelers encounter him. Two take a look and then move to the other side of the road. One, a priest, might have been afraid that if the victim were dead, the priest would have been ceremonially contaminated and suspended from the temple for seven days of purification. An inconvenience. The Levite was someone who knew what the law required. He might have speculated that the battered man was a decoy, not unheard of, and he would be the next victim. Better safe than sorry. Both men thought of their own needs first.

The Samaritan looked and was moved by compassion. He brought inconvenience and expense on himself. He didn't care that the victim was not a Samaritan. He didn't just give sympathy. He gave practical aid: wound care, refuge, and money for any other need. He promised to come back and check on the outcome of his assistance.

Who is my neighbor? He is the person who takes trouble for others. He extends his concern as widely as the love of God, to all people. He gives practical, useful help. Not just feelings, but actions. When we are Good Samaritans, we live the Second Greatest Commandment.
