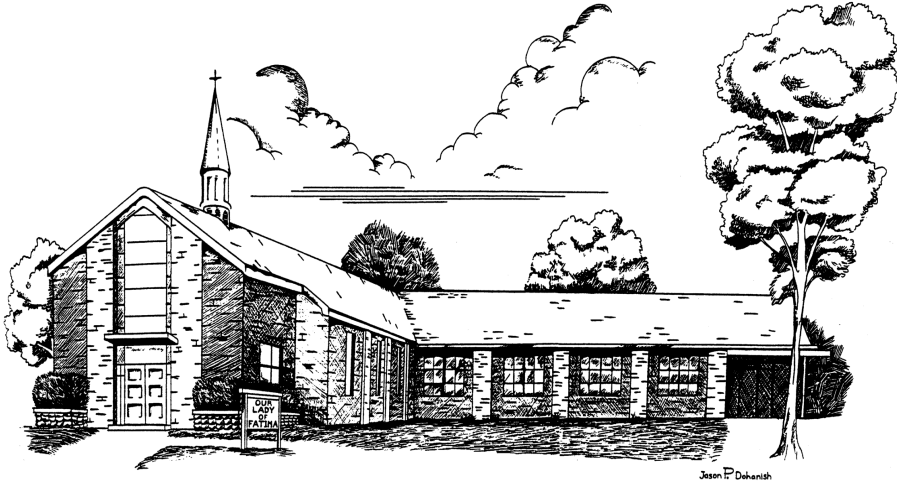

TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

We have left the Easter Season and celebrated three great solemnities: Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, and Corpus Christi. Our vestments and altar have been white. Now, we go back to green; we return to Ordinary Time. In the Sunday readings of Ordinary Time, there is a concentration on the preaching of Jesus regarding the Kingdom of Heaven. It is time to “get back to business,” the business of our lives, getting to heaven.

In today's Gospel, we find Jesus bringing his friends to His home for a visit. He is also attracting a crowd. The visit is filled with turmoil and conflict. Jesus' family is upset that He has become a cause of controversy: **He is out of His mind!** The religious and social authorities see Him as a dangerous threat: **He is possessed by the devil!**

While differently motivated, the family of Jesus and the “important people” assume that any sensible person knows that there are three rules for social success: security, safety, and adhering to society's verdict. “Sensible” people organize their lives with this in mind. “Prudent” people avoid problems by accepting norms of behavior. Jesus is not following the norms.

Security requires stability; stability means avoiding going outside the customs and mores of society. “Play by the rules.” “Go with the flow.” “Stay under the radar.” “Play it safe.” “Get on his good side.” “Take no risks.” “Sensible” people form their actions by judging what is right and what is wrong using the standard: “What will people say?” What people say becomes more important than moral quality.

In His preaching and behavior, Jesus had violated all of these sensible and prudent rules. He didn't care about social verdicts. His friends were certainly not the elites, socially or intellectually: fishermen, a reformed tax-collector, women with questionable pasts, gentiles.

When Jesus goes home for a visit, He finds unpleasant sound and fury. He is saddened to find that the voice of the neighbor is louder than the voice of God. In the Ordinary Time of Salvation History, our goal is to ignore the noise of our culture and society. Like Jesus, we are called to listen, hear, and act on the voice of God alone.

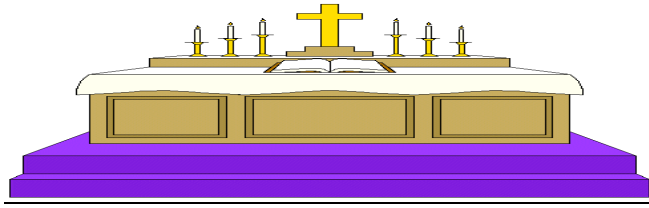
One of our parishioners designed and created an old-fashioned Poor Box for us. We thank him. It has been placed right under the portrait of Our Lady of Perpetual Help.
