Last week and this, we see the heart of Jesus moved by pity at the sight of hungry and tired crowds of people. Philip, who was a native of Bethsaida, the site of this mob scene, was asked by Jesus to help supply the crowd with food. Philip judged it a hopeless situation.

Andrew, on the other hand, looked around and spotted a boy with five barley loaves and two fish. Barley loaves were the bread of the poor. Small, flavorless, and coarse. The fish were from the Sea of Galilee, about the size of sardines; they were pickled. With such meager resources, Andrew was obviously someone who works against the odds.

In the earlier part of the ministry of Jesus, it was Andrew who introduced people to Jesus. They were people, who had little to offer, but offered what they had. The same dynamic occurs in today's gospel. Andrew sees what he can do with what he has and trusts Jesus to do the rest.

What we have to offer may not be much, but Jesus can use it. He will take what service we give him. He will make miracles.

### **BISHOP'S ANNUAL APPEAL**

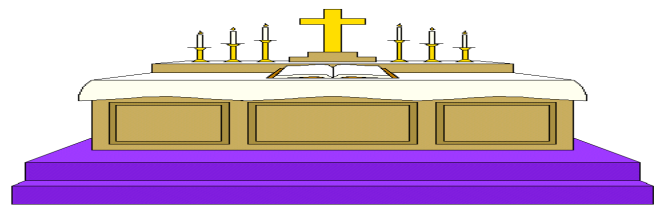
