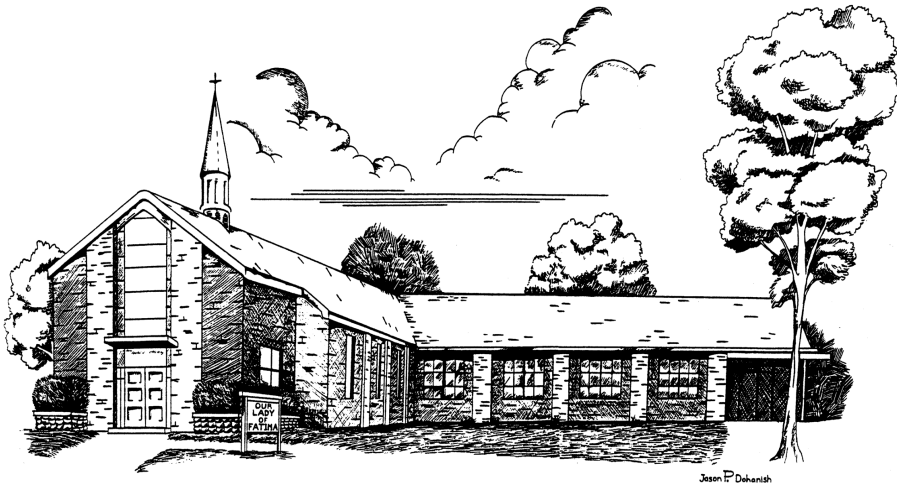

TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Mark's gospel is warning that corruption and evil are always at war with the mission of Jesus Christ. Goodness and righteousness are always rewarded. The Holy Spirit is the primary motivating force for the revelation of God. Success is not dependent on the disciples.

Some of them were pursuing their own agendas. Some of us do the same. Jesus praises the well-meaning seekers of goodness, who have not had the privilege of hearing His words. Jesus harshly warns the disciples to cut out and cut off whatever part of them makes them mediocre believers.

You are either with me or against me. As disciples, we are to hold ourselves to the highest standards and to honor and support the goodness in everyone we meet. To cause no harm. Most importantly, salvation has been brought to the world by Jesus Christ. His victory is inexorable. We are allowed to participate in this work. If we refuse or hinder this work, we will pay.

FROM THE DESK OF FR. RICARDO:

My Dear Brothers in Christ,

The New Jersey Catholic Conference of Bishops has approved a statewide postcard and petition campaign urging the State Senators and Assembly women/men to support the NJ Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act A1686/S537. If passed this bill would protect babies in the womb at 20 weeks—that is 5 months and beyond. The campaign will be launched on the weekend of October 6/7, 2018 which is Respect Life Weekend.

Some facts we know about the baby in the womb at 20 weeks/5 months.

- The baby in the womb at 20 weeks/5 months is fully formed and needs to grow in length and weight.
- All of his/her vital organs are formed and functioning—the heart, lungs, kidney, brain, nervous system, etc.
- We know that babies at 20 weeks/5 months with good medical care can survive outside the womb.
- Because of the babies' maturity at 20 weeks, we know the baby is capable of feeling pain—thus The Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act.
- Thus far, 17 states have enacted laws to protect babies in the womb at 20 weeks and beyond.

- The United States is one of seven countries that allow elective abortions after 20 weeks and beyond. The other countries include China, North Korea, Viet Nam, Singapore, Canada and the Netherlands.

On the weekend of October 6th and 7th, you will find a three sectioned postcard in your pew. By signing these cards, you will show your support for the "***Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act***"

The Diocesan Parishes together in common prayer will participate in the "***Ring Out for Life***" on October 7th (*Divine Mercy Hour*).

Our Church bells will ring for "ONE MINUTE" followed by praying the community Rosary outside our Church. We invite you and your family and all people of good will who want to join us in this manner.

A Pro Life Volunteer will be available after each Mass on October 6th and 7th to answer any questions you may have on this matter.

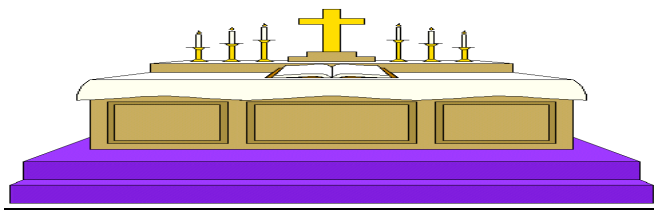

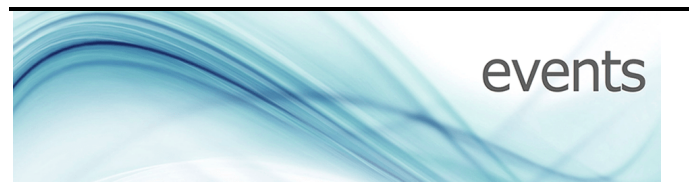
