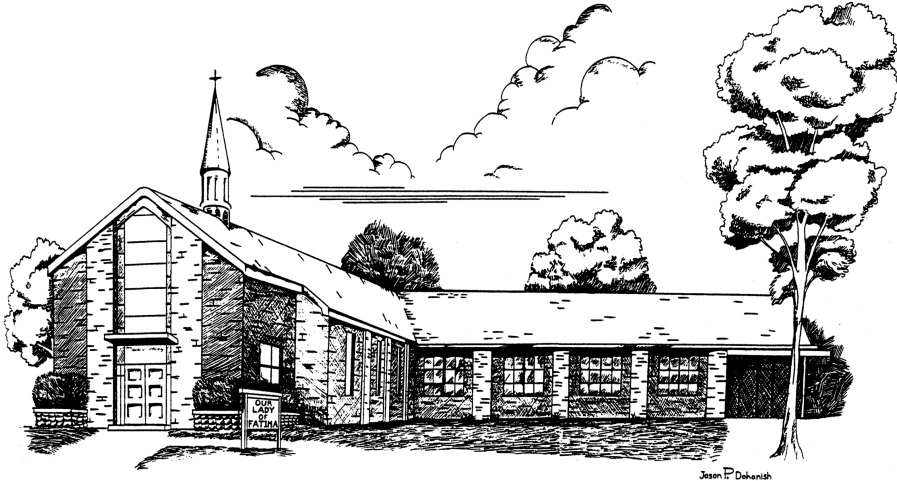

BEING A SLAVE TO ALL

In human society, individuals organize very naturally into roles and places. In the first community established by Jesus, tradition depicts Judas as the money manager of the group. Peter, James, and John were spokespersons and representatives of the more quiet and less assertive apostles.

In today's gospel, Mark presents an awkward, almost embarrassing scene. James and John were engaged in self-promotion. Future saints, James and John, were playing politics in a sacred society. Together, they approached Jesus and asked for places of prestige when Jesus established His kingdom. They wanted personal power and authority. They were acting like social climbers, who really did not comprehend the message Jesus had been delivering for three years. Their bid for importance angered the other apostles. Jesus warned: *...whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant.*

As Christians, our work is to form community and to become great in humble service to one another and to the Body of Christ. *... whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all.* The Christian community is not the place to lord it over others. The Christian community is not the place to delude ourselves into believing that we are more significant in doing the work of God than others. We are not more important than anyone else. The Christian community is the place to grow humble and obedient to the Will of the Father. The place to become Christ-

PRAYING THE ROSARY

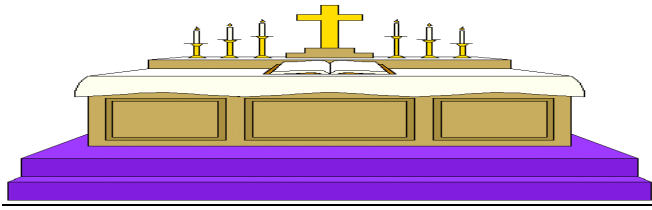

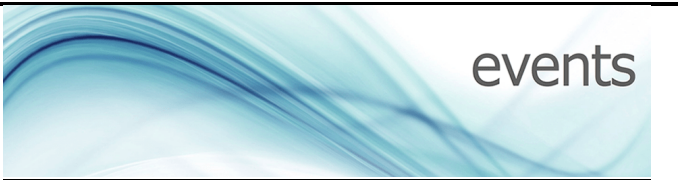
